Phone calling

Three ways to initiate a phone call

- tap the numbers
- Siri: dictate the numbers
- Siri: use Contacts

- calling Maryl (mobile)







Initiate: "Hey Siri, email _____"

• choose correct recipient if more than one

Subject: Siri asks, "What's the subject?"

dictate subject of email

Body: Siri asks, "What would you like email to say?"

- dictate email
- Siri says, "Here's your message. Are you ready to send?"
 - * If Yes, say "Yes."
 - * If No, she offers "Send," "Cancel," "Change subject," "Add," or "Change message."

Tap email icon, then box icon with pencil

Recipient

- in "To" field, the cursor is blinking
- tap microphone —> dictate recipient's first or last name
- tap correct recipient if more than one appears

Subject line (optional)

- tap "Subject"
- tap microphone —> dictate subject of email

Email body

- tap body of email
- tap microphone —> dictate message
