Home screen: Organizing







- 4. Double tap (a photo)
- 5. Pinch & spread (a photo)
- 6. Multi-finger pinch (to home screen)
- 7. Swipe (to different screen)
- 8. Flick (Safari, NY Times)
- 9. Scroll (Safari, NY Times)



Touchscreen & gestures: Practice

- 1. Control center: swipe up from bottom
- 2. Safari: tap to open
 tap a tab to visit a previous page
 tap x to remove that tab
 tap URL bar and enter a query
- 3. Photos: tap to open tap a photo spread OR double tap to enlarge it pinch to return to photos multi-finger pinch to return to home screen 8
